Distracted Drivers in Crashes (2007-2010) Electronic Device

- Oklahoma crash reports are completed by law enforcement officers at the scene of a crash and show when a driver is distracted by an electronic device, largely based on self-reporting.
- The two choices officers have for indicating distraction by electronic devices are:
 - Electronic communications device (cell phone, pager, etc.)
 - Other electronic device (navigation device, Palm Pilot, etc.)
- In 2007, 10 fatal crashes, 693 injury crashes and 912 non-injury crashes involved a driver distracted by an electronic device.
- In 2008, 13 fatal crashes, 661 injury crashes and 1,016 non-injury crashes involved a driver distracted by an electronic device.
- In 2009, 10 fatal crashes, 683 injury crashes and 1,039 non-injury crashes involved a driver distracted by an electronic device.
- In 2010, 9 fatal crashes, 547 injury crashes and 818 non-injury crashes involved a driver distracted by an electronic device.
