COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Intoxilyzer 8000 Certification

The Model 8000 Intoxilyzer manufactured by CMI, Inc., Owensboro, KY is approved for analysis of alcohol in breath specimens. The instrument is considered an automated analyzer. All analyses conducted by state, county, and municipal law enforcement officials are performed in accordance with the Oklahoma State Statutes and the Board of Tests regulations, which require the certification of all aspects of breath testing. These breath alcohol analyses are performed in conjunction with various alcohol related criminal offenses and the enforcement of the implied consent laws.

This is a CLEET accredited class that upon successful completion will earn the student 8 hours of continuing education. There is \$60.00 cost for initial certification and a \$12.00 cost yearly to renew the certification. Any commissioned law enforcement officer is welcome to attend.

ARIDE

A Training Option Bridging the GAP between SFST and DRE

The Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement (ARIDE) program was developed by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) with input from the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP), Technical Advisory Panel (TAP), and the Virginia Association of Chiefs of Police. ARIDE was created to address the gap in training between the Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST) and the Drug Evaluation and Classification (DEC/DRE) Program.

The SFST program trains officers to identify and assess drivers suspected of being under the influence of alcohol, while the DEC/DRE program provides more advanced training to evaluate suspected drug impairment. The SFST assessment is typically employed at roadside, while an officer trained as a Drug Recognition Expert (DRE) through the DEC program conducts a 12-step evaluation in a more controlled environment such as a jail or a detention facility.

ARIDE is intended to bridge the gap between the SFST and DEC/DRE programs by providing officers with general knowledge related to drug impairment and by promoting the use of DREs in states that have the DEC Program. One of the more significant aspects of ARIDE is the required student demonstration of the SFST proficiency requirement. The ARIDE program stresses the importance of the signs and symptoms of the seven drug categories. This course will train law enforcement officers to observe, identify and articulate the signs of impairment related to drugs, alcohol, or a combination of both, in order to reduce the number of impaired driving incidents as well as crashes which result in serious injuries and fatalities. This course will educate other criminal justice professionals (prosecutors, toxicologists, judges, etc.) to understand the signs of impairment

related to drugs, alcohol, or a combination of both, to enable them to effectively work with law enforcement in order to reduce the number of impaired driving incidents as well as crashes which result in serious injuries and fatalities.

ARIDE is a 16-hour training course and is taught by DRE instructors. The following summarizes the sessions contained in the ARIDE course:

Introduction and Overview of Drugs and Highway Safety
SFST Update, Review and Proficiency Examination
Observations of Eyes and other Sobriety Tests to Detect Alcohol and Drug Impairment
Seven Drug Categories
Effects of Drug Combinations
Pre- and Post-Arrest Procedures

The training will be conducted under the administration and approval of the DEC/DRE program state coordinator.

The ARIDE-course can be used as an SFST update. This course is designed to build on the Standardized Field Sobriety Test practitioner course. In order for the participant to effectively utilize the information presented in this course, NHTSA has set a prerequisite of SFST proficiency. The participant will receive a short review and update. All participants are required to pass an SFST proficiency evaluation. Failure to successfully complete the SFST proficiency evaluation will result in dismissal from class.

DWI Detection and Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST Training) Initial

The Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST) training prepares police officers and other qualified persons to administer and interpret the results of the DWI Detection and SFST battery.

DWI Detection and Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST) Basic Course may have a Wet Lab.

This course was developed by NHTSA and approved by the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP). National standards have been established by IACP to ensure consistency in the content, delivery, and application of this training program. The NHTSA/IACP basic course is the only curriculum that meets these standards.

During the 24-hour training program, law enforcement officers learn:

- How to recognize behavior that points toward impaired driving;
- The importance of the SFST battery, and how to properly administer the tests. This is reinforced through the use of two correlation workshops;
- When to make an impaired driving arrest;
- How to write accurate and detailed reports;
- How to give clear and convincing testimony.

This is a CLEET accredited class that upon successful completion will earn the student 24 hours of continuing education Credit (3 - 8 hour days)

DWI Detection and Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST Training) Instructor

The Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST) Instructor training prepares police officers and other qualified persons to teach the administration and interpretation of the results of the DWI Detection and SFST battery.

ATTENDEES MUST BE PROFICIENT IN ADMINISTERING THE SFST BATTERY OF TESTS. ON THE 1ST DAY OF CLASS ATTENDEES MUST DEMONSTRATE THIS PROFICENCY TO COURSE INSTRUCTORS IN ORDER TO REMAIN IN THE CLASS.

Topics covered:

Concepts of adult learning

SFST Curriculum package

Techniques for effective classroom and courtroom presentation

Video options for SFST training

Teaching preparation techniques

There will be 2 written exams and 2 practical exams that students must pass to complete the course.

This course was developed by NHTSA and approved by the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP). National standards have been established by IACP to ensure consistency in the content, delivery, and application of this training program. The NHTSA/IACP basic course is the only curriculum that meets these standards.

During the 40-hour training program, law enforcement officers learn how to instruct:

- How to recognize behavior that points toward impaired driving;
- The importance of the SFST battery, and how to properly administer the tests. This is reinforced through the use of two correlation workshops;
- When to make an impaired driving arrest;
- How to write accurate and detailed reports;
- How to give clear and convincing testimony.

This is a CLEET accredited class that upon successful completion will earn the student 40 hours of continuing education Credit (5 - 8 hour days)

This SFST Refresher training program is intended for the purpose of Refresher Training Only. This Program is not a substitute for NHTSA/IACP Approved DWI Detection and Standardized Field sobriety Testing Training.

DWI Detection and Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST) Refresher

This course will refresh your skills in evaluating impaired driving suspects, from the initial observation of the vehicle to the arrest and processing of the suspect.

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) and the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) recommend that officers who may be responsible for conducting a DWI investigation attend periodic refresher training to maintain both their skills in detecting impaired drivers and proficiency in administration of the Standardized Field Sobriety Tests (SFSTs). This course will provide the latest revisions to the program, along with relevant legal changes for DWI prosecution.
